We offer a wide variety of programs (A.T.A.K. - Agincourt Tennis Academy for Kids) which are designed for kid to have fun and meet new friends while learning. These various A.T.A.K programs cover all levels from beginners, where a social setting is more prominent to a more advanced level where we focus the improvement of their tennis game.

Spring Lessons

The May-June Spring Beginner/new Intermediate lessons are one of the Club's most popular programs for kids. First time junior players are especially welcome, as they will be taught the basic skills of the sport. More experienced players, but basically still beginners, also benefit from this program as the class is divided into skill levels and taught accordingly by friendly certified instructors. This program is a prerequisite for the ATAK program.

STF Junior Team

Each year the Agincourt Tennis Club enters several boys and girls teams in the junior STF league, where junior teams from surrounding clubs compete for the Scarborough championship trophy. Singles and double matches in various age categories are played once a week at various clubs. Our girls' team is presently the Champions for 2002, 2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007 and 2008... while our boy's team, were the champions in 2002. If you have a competitive spirit and wish to join a team, please let us know. League play starts in early May.

Davis Cup Round Robin

This program is geared to promote leadership, team spirit, team building and team support in a friendly sociable team competition environment. Junior players from beginners to our top STF team players can compete in this event. Each player is placed in a team representing one of several countries, then it's team versus team, competing every week for close to two months. On the final week, all teams compete in the championship playoffs, complete with a BBQ luncheon and medal presentations. All teams players will receive their countries team medal with the winning team receiving a championship medal and also having their individual names engraved on the Davis Cup Trophy plaque (located in the Agincourt Tennis Club clubhouse) for all to see.

This program is for years kids of all ages and skill levels who enjoys having fun in a team competition atmosphere.

ATAK Program

The Agincourt Tennis Club is known for its ATAK program. It features advance training for players preparing them for tournament ready through intense footwork and stroke drills, routines, practice sessions and match play under the guidance of certified instructors and the watchful eye of our Club Coach. - Prerequisites may be required.

Summer Sizzle

The Summer Sizzle program is a drop in tennis camp for those members who want to have some tennis fun playing casual tennis related games in a group environment. Under the supervision of an experience club member and older junior volunteers, participants will partake in some tennis hitting drills, single and double round robin matches and a whole lot of tennis fun and games (good clean exercise in the great outdoors). This program runs every Tuesday and Thursday throughout most of the summer months of July and August. A nominal fee is charged for this program.

OTA Tennis Fair

Around mid summer just before the Rogers' Cup Tournament in Toronto, the Agincourt Tennis Club invites the OTA (Ontario Tennis Association) to come to our courts to run a Tennis Fun Fair. Juniors here will be able to demo new racquets, test their serving skills and participate in some fun and games to win prizes. There is usually a nominal fee charged by the OTA (around \$8), but you get some great stuff, an OTA 2009 T-shirt and a couple of Rogers' Cup tickets to name a few. This event is open to members and non-members alike and has in the past been a fun time for all those who participated. Junior Tournament

Our Junior Tournament follows the ATAK program as the final major program for the year. All skill levels from beginner to OTA Tournament player can compete and have fun in this contest. The tournament features three (A, B and C) levels of play so everyone can participate and win. Trophies and prizes are awarded to all champions and runner-ups in both the main and consolation draws.

This tournament is free of charge and is open to all JUNIOR REGISTERED MEMBERS ONLY.

Junior / Adult Tournament

This is a fun event where juniors are teamed up with an adult member to play doubles matches in a non-competitive fun tournament style atmosphere. The teams are arranged so that the stronger adult player partners with a less experienced junior and vice-versa. Along with some special rules, this levels out the playing field so that any team can win. With food and beverages provided, this day event has proven to be a fun time for all participating special members.
